About Forum Theatre

This action-oriented education program uses interactive forum techniques to transform students from passive spectators into active participants, or 'spect-actors'. Students are encouraged to role play as they explore real-world scenarios and develop strategies for dealing with social issues and health pressures that affect their day to day lives.

The program fosters resilience and encourages youth to speak up and confidently enter into conversation about issues that concern them.

Gabrielle and Taj are in year 11 at the same school, trying to navigate what consent actually means.

Would You commences with a short film exploring how consent permeates almost every aspect of our relationships with others, including family, friends, dating, and romantic partners.

The Youth Choices team facilitate interactive discussions, roleplay, and scenarios that encourage students to see diverse perspectives. Students explore the impact of negative responses or behaviour on personal relationships, and develop empathy and understanding of what consent looks like in varied situations, taking steps to be aware of asking for consent and respecting when it is not given.
